Winter Safety

It's that time of year when the snow will begin to fall. Here are a few reminders to help keep our children and homeowners safe during this time of year. Please keep the sidewalks cleared of snow and ice (Canton Twp. Sec. 62-37 - Ice and snow removal). When using a snow blower to clear your sidewalk and driveway, please do not blow the snow into the street (or onto your neighbors' driveway).

MOST IMPORTANTLY, please do not park on street when Snow Removal Conditions Exist. This will expedite the removal of snow from the streets and ensure your vehicle isn't damaged in the process. CRHA is not responsible for any damages that occur when vehicles are parked on the street.



Storm Drains

Please keep the storm drains located on the streets cleared of any debris. This will ensure our streets do not flood by capturing excess rain and ground water from the streets and sidewalks.

Furthermore, no foreign substance should be placed in or poured into any storm drain as the runoff is discharged into the retention pond by Saltz road. This will ensure the eco-system of the retention pond is maintained and uninterrupted.
